SUBJECT: HOTEL TAX COLLECTIONS THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2021

- Collections Up \$1,895,260 or 68.1% vs. Prior Yr. Through the 1st Qtr. of FY22
- Collections are Above Projection by \$783,588 or 20.1% Through the 1st Qtr. of FY22

HOTEL TAX COLLECTIONS

Hotel taxes are collected by local hotels and remitted to the City the following month. This report summarizes hotel tax collections for the first quarter of fiscal year 2022 and is limited exclusively to hotel tax. Any sales tax collected by hotels is reported separately in the monthly sales and use tax City Manager report.

The distribution of collections from the City's 5.5% hotel tax is shown below and is set by ordinance:

- 4/11 to Promote Convention and Tourism
- 6/11 for Fairgrounds Improvements
- 1/11 to Sponsor and Promote Local Events

The following table represents year-to-date revenue collections and annual projections for each of these purposes:

Hotel Tax for the City of Oklahoma City continued to increase during the first quarter of fiscal year 2022. Business travel and leisure stay has continued to increase causing hotel tax to outperform projections. Hotel tax collections in August were the highest on record for the City
