SUBJECT: MAY 2016 SALES AND USE TAX COLLECTIONS

Combined sales and use taxes for the General Fund are \$15,254,771 or 6.3% below projections for the year.

General Fund Sales Tax

Note: With the enactment of House Bill 1875 on July 1, 2015, the retention fee paid to the Oklahoma Tax Commission for collection of sales and use taxes decreased from 1% to 0.5%. Overall comparisons of sales tax will include the additional 0.5%, while comparisons of specific categories will not be affected.

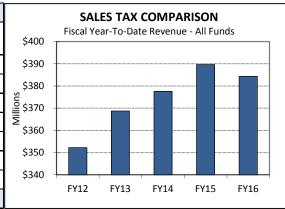
General Fund sales tax collections for May totaled \$17,930,254, which is:

- \$1,271,903 or 6.6% below projection for the month
- \$533,358 or 2.9% below FY 2015 collections for the month

The May remittance includes actual collections for the second half of March and estimated collections for the first half of April by major taxpayers.

Overall sales tax revenues are down 3.4% this month. 89% of the decline is due to utilities sales that are notably down from what they were last year. Natural gas prices have declined significantly since last year which affects both natural gas sales and electricity sales. Until natural gas prices return to prior levels, this trend is likely to continue.

Comparison to Other Cities

Oklahoma City's sales tax growth was the lowest of the comparison cities, with slumping oil and gas industry sales still a likely factor. Most major cities reported moderate sales tax growth. The combined growth rate of the top twenty cities in Oklahoma was 0.1%. Netting out both Oklahoma City and Tulsa, the growth rate equaled 2.9%.

<u>Retail</u>

- General Merchandise Sales slipped as the majority of major retailer's reported declines.
- Building Materials and Lawn & Garden Sales were good, but much of the increase was due
 to the addition of a business that was previously listed under Wholesale.
- Apparel & Accessories Last month's sales were strong across the board in this category.
 This month's decline appears to be a natural offset.
- Electronics & Appliances While the majority of retailers showed improvement this month, several of the larger businesses did not.
- Miscellaneous Retail Most of the decline was due to greatly reduced sales this year from a mining related business and a large payment last year from another business.
- Sporting Goods & Hobby Stores While sales were down slightly for the majority, the addition of a new major sporting goods retailer this year has positively affected growth.

Other Major Categories

- Hotels & Restaurants rose 5.9% from last year.
 - Eating & Drinking Establishments gained 5.8% with most businesses performing well.
 - Hotel sales were up 6.6% due in part to the reclassification of a few hotels formerly listed as Non-Classified.
- Services are down 2.9% with 15 of the top 25 businesses reporting declines in sales.
- Wholesale declined 6.8% due to lower sales and the reclassification of a business to Retail.
- Utilities dropped 42.3% as the price of gas and electricity has fallen in recent months.
- Manufacturing slipped 0.7%. Sales were up for most manufacturers, but the majority of the larger manufacturers reported decreased sales.
- Other Miscellaneous increased 10.7%. Most of the increase comes from new remitters in Non-Classified.

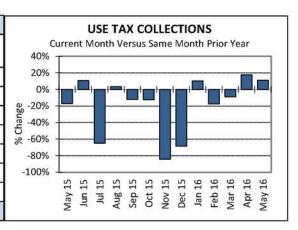
General Fund Use Tax

General Fund use tax collections for May totaled \$3,127,726 which is:

- \$398,230 or 11.3% below projection for the month
- \$311,765 or 11.1% above FY 2015 collections for the month

Overall use taxes grew 10.5% this month. A big refund last year in Other Miscellaneous and a big payment this year in Wholesale contributed to all of this month's growth.
